The Master of Arts in Clinical Counseling (MACC) Program trains enrolled students to apply counseling theories and techniques in psychotherapeutic modalities including individual counseling, group therapy, couples and family counseling. Students are taught to assess, diagnose, and treat cognitive, behavioral and emotional presenting issues including personal growth, academic and career issues, couple and family issues, trauma and crisis, substance addiction and abuse; adjustment to disability and mental health issues across the human lifespan. The academic program is practitioner-oriented in its focus; and students are taught to integrate theory and research into practice and develop both a strong theoretical foundation and an evidence-based practice for working with a wide range of clients.

The MACC Program originated in 2011 at the San Francisco Campus and expanded to the Fresno Campus in 2013. The program began the online modality in 2017. The Program is grounded philosophically in the American Counseling Association’s Ethical Codes, Social Justice Advocacy model, Multicultural Competencies, and is directed by Alliant International University’s core values: integrity, intellectual advancement, diversity, social responsibility, innovation, stewardship, and community partnership.

The MACC Program incorporates and satisfies the educational requirements of the **California Board of Behavioral Sciences** and is designed to meet the licensing requirements for Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor as listed in the Business and Professions Code (BPC) Section 4999.32 (as required by BPC Section 4999.40(a)).

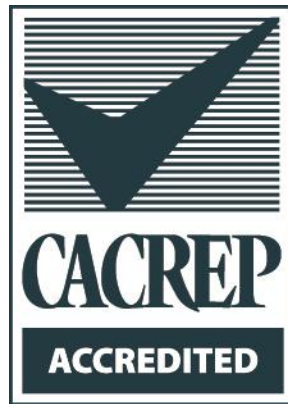
The **National Board of Certified Counselors** have approved the MACC Program curriculum, our students are eligible to become National Certified Counselors. <https://www.nbcc.org/>
